ArtsLink provides a unique opportunity for creative exchange and dialogue between the arts communities of the United States and Central and Eastern Europe, Russia, Central Asia and the Caucasus. Over the past 17 years, ArtsLink has made 4 million dollars in funding available to U.S. artists and arts organizations. ArtsLink offers awards through the following programs:

**ArtsLink Projects** support U.S. artists, curators, presenters and arts organizations to undertake projects in Central and Eastern Europe, Russia, Central Asia and the Caucasus.

**ArtsLink Residencies** place artists and arts managers from Central and Eastern Europe, Russia, Central Asia and the Caucasus—ArtsLink Fellows—at U.S. organizations for five-week residencies.

**Independent Projects** support artists and arts managers from Central and Eastern Europe, Russia, Central Asia and the Caucasus who have been invited by a U.S. non-profit arts organization to undertake a self-managed project in the U.S.

- ◆ The creation of nomadic art space in Bulgaria by 2007 Rome Prize recipient Daniel Bozhkov in collaboration with the Institute for Contemporary Art, Sofia
- ◆ A film by The Museum of Jurassic Technology with the Russian arts journal *Kabinet* which was produced in Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Russia and Ukraine
